School Uniform Policy - Appendix

This Policy runs alongside the Aspire MAT School Uniform Policy. The information within this Appendix outlines the uniform children are required to wear at Kirkby Woodhouse School.





Children must wear the correct uniform to school. This does not need to have the KWS logo on, as we appreciate there is an additional cost for this. If parents/carers would like uniform with the school logo, this is available to order directly online through www.sabresportsproducts.co.uk. However, school uniform in our school colours without the KWS logo can be purchased from a range of supermarkets.

Parents/carers can also enquire at the School Office for any 'previously loved' school uniform, as very often there are items available. If parents/carers are struggling to purchase school uniform because of financial circumstances, please do come in and talk to us.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Black or grey skirt, shorts, trousers or pinafores.
- White blouse/shirt or white polo-neck t-shirt.
- Dark green jumper or cardigan.
- Green and white summer school dresses.
- Black or grey tights.
- Black, grey or white socks.
- Flat, plain black school shoes that are sturdy and polishable – **NO TRAINERS.**



Those with Velcro fastenings are the easiest for children to use, especially when changing to and from their playtime wellies for OPAL.

PE KIT

- On the days your child has PE, they are to come to school in their PE kit for the day.
- Plain white t-shirt – this must be plain as we **DO NOT** allow branded/logo clothes.
- Plain black shorts or black leggings/joggers – these must be plain, as we **DO NOT** allow branded/logo clothes.
- Plain black hoodie or zip-up top – these must be plain, as we **DO NOT** allow branded/logo clothes.
- Trainers – sport-specific, designed for running/sports, as we **DO NOT** allow fashion trainers (e.g., Converse, Vans, canvas shoes, platform trainers). These do not provide the necessary support or grip and increase injury risk.
- We aim to be outside as much as possible for PE, so in colder months, please ensure your child has their coat/waterproof in school.

OPAL PLAYTIMES

- All children **MUST HAVE** a pair of wellies in school for OPAL playtimes. Please ensure these are labelled with your child's name.
- Waterproofs (trousers or an all-in-one puddle suit) are optional. Please ensure these are labelled with your child's name if brought into school.
- We will have spare waterproofs in school for children to use.



HAIR STYLES

- Children's hair must be neat and tidy and not extreme in any way. This includes no tightly shaven hair, no patterns shaved in, no braids, and no permanent or temporary coloured hair.
- For PE lessons, all long hair, if touching the shoulders or beyond, for both boys and girls, must be tied back.
- When children have their hair tied back, this needs to be with suitable sized bow, clips, headbands or bobbles in school colours – green/white/black.
- We do not let children wear large or bright coloured accessories, e.g. large bows or hair braids.

JEWELLERY / ACCESSORIES

- Children may wear a watch, but this must be without internet, messaging, camera, social media or communication access.
- Children may wear one pair of stud earrings worn in the lower ear lobe.
- For safety reasons, all studs must be removed for PE. If children have only recently had their ears pierced, then they can put tape over the studs until the period of time that enables them to remove them.
- Ideally, on the days when children have PE, we ask parents/carers not to send their child with earrings in.
- No other jewellery must be worn for school, including bracelets and necklaces, unless for religious reasons agreed with the school.
- Please note that school will be unable to take any responsibility for any watches or jewellery that are lost.

NAIL VARNISH & MAKEUP

- **NO** false/gel nails or nail varnish in school.
- Children are **NOT** allowed to wear face makeup.
- Parents will be called into school to remove these or the child asked to wash it off their face.

MOBILE PHONES

- **WE DO NOT ALLOW CHILDREN TO BRING MOBILE PHONES INTO SCHOOL.**
- In the very exceptional circumstance that a child needs to bring a phone in (e.g. going from one parent's house to the other parent's house mid-week), then parents/carers must communicate this in advance with the class teacher. In this case, the class teacher will lock the phone away for the duration of the school day. Phones must be always switched off whilst on the school site. Once a child has their phones given to them at home time, they must not use it or switch it on whilst on the school premises.
- If a child has a mobile phone with them in school that hasn't been pre-arranged with the class teacher, or if a child uses their phone whilst on the school premises, then parents will be phoned and asked to come and collect the phone and the child will not be allowed to bring their phone to school for the rest of the school year.

NAMING CLOTHING

- **VERY IMPORTANT** – Please ensure all school uniform (including their coat) is clearly labelled with your child's name so it can be returned to them if it becomes lost/left out on the playground/field.
- Lost property is located in the large green tubs on the path by the playground.
